1. Overall, the Supreme Court performed well this year. Based on JAGF's recommendations, 9 out of the most important 14 cases were decided rightly based on the Constitution.
2. The Constitutional stalwarts on the Court, Justices Thomas and Alito, will likely continue to serve in their roles for at least another year. Historically, justices retire in June or July to give the President time to vet potential nominees.

Prayers for JAGf

- The National Consecration of Our Courts (October 4-5) event is only two months away. Pray that the mission of consecration would take precedence over any man made goal. Pray that the Lord would bring the right intercessors to join us.
- The Lord has begun to expand JAGf's activities in its second year as a tax deductible non-profit. Pray that the Lord would give JAGf and its leadership provision, guidance, favor, and wisdom.



Prayers for the Court

1. Pray that the Justices will be able to rest and recuperate before the next term. Pray that the Lord encounters every single Justice in a new way and that they would personally pray and call on His name.
2. Pray that the Lord protects the Justices from every plot, that He blesses their security personnel, and preserves their lives.
3. Pray for the physical and mental health of the Justices and that all attacks of the enemy would fail.

Case in Focus

While the Supreme Court is officially out of session until October, it can still make decisions for relief depending on the circumstance. An example of may have implications for the midterm elections.

Trump v. State of California

Judge Talwani of the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts [voided two sections of President Trump's executive order 14399](#) creating voter rolls of U.S. citizens and requiring the USPS to only deliver to individuals eligible to vote. The judge ruled that President Trump was acting outside of his authority and that the USPS does not have the right to restrict election mail in Federal elections.

On Monday, July 28th, Solicitor General D. John Sauer asked the Supreme Court to overturn the injunction, in part, since the agencies had not finalized rules complying with the executive order. Justice Ketanji Brown directed California and the other states to respond by August 3rd.

Topics for Prayer

1. That the Supreme Court would use wisdom and follow the Lord while responding to Pres. Trump's Executive Order.
2. That only citizens of the United States who are registered to vote would be able to vote in the upcoming election.



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
