Prayers for JAGf

- The National Consecration of Our Courts (October 4-5) event is two weeks away. Pray that prayers for the Supreme Court would be directed by the Word of God and the Holy Spirit. Pray that the Lord would bring the right intercessors to join us.
- The next Supreme Court term will begin directly after the NCC Event. Pray that JAGF, and our President, Phillip Jauregui, would have discernment on how best to prepare for the next set of Supreme Court cases.

Supreme Court News

Join us in praying that righteousness and justice would prevail in response to the following news:

- On September 14th, [the Supreme Court declined to lift a lower-court injunction](#) blocking implementation of [the U.S. Postal Service's new mail-in ballot rules](#) for the upcoming election. The USPS rules included specific envelope requirements and the creation of a new Federal Ballot Mail Portal. Justice Alito and Justice Thomas both dissented and would have overturned the lower court imposed injunction.
- Justice Kavanaugh signaled that the rule may be upheld in future elections, but he believed it was too close to the current election for the USPS rule to be applied. While the new rules drafted by the USPS will not be used in the upcoming election, pray that all voting fraud will be discovered and not impact the results of the upcoming election.

Case in Focus

Nathan v. Alamo Heights Independent School District (Pending)

[The September 1st-15th Prayer Briefing highlighted](#) this pending case on the Constitutionality of the Ten Commandments in Texas schools. If the Supreme Court agrees to hear the case, this will be an important opportunity for the Supreme Court to help restore our national relationship with God.

A number of rulings by the Supreme Court between the 1960s and 1980s directly removed the Lord from the United States public life. These decisions created a breach in our national relationship with God. Specifically, in *Stone vs. Graham* (1980), the Supreme Court ruled that a Kentucky law requiring each public school classroom to feature a copy of the Ten Commandments was unconstitutional because it “had no secular legislative purpose” and was “plainly religious in nature.” The underlying test used in the 1980 ruling was rejected by the current Supreme Court in *Kennedy v. Bremerton School District* (2022) (Coach Kennedy prayer case). With this pending case, the Supreme Court has the opportunity to overrule *Stone vs. Graham* and acknowledge the importance of the Ten Commandments and God in our nation.

Topics for Prayer

1. That the Supreme Court would accept the case and find the Texas law Constitutional.
2. More importantly, that the opinion would recognize the importance of God’s role in our government and acknowledge that prior Supreme Court rulings removing God from public life were incorrect.

Prayers for the Court

1. Pray that the Justices will be convicted of the importance of their role and that they would fear God and not man.
2. Pray that the Justices would recognize that the United States was founded as a Christian nation and that our ideals are ineffective without reliance on the Giver of those ideals.
3. Pray that the Lord protects the Justices from every plot, that He blesses their security personnel, and preserves their lives.
